
OPERATION PHILLIP



Why 21 days?

For the next 21 days, we are uniting as a church to seek God with one heart and one voice. These days are not just a routine. They are a spiritual journey of transformation. Every devotional, every prayer, every fast, and every act of evangelism has a purpose. Here's why:

Devotional: Feeding on the Word of God

The Word of God is our daily bread. Each devotional will guide us to drink deeply from Scripture, allowing the Holy Spirit to renew our minds, heal our hearts, and align us with His will. When we sit at His feet daily, we are strengthened to live out His truth.

Prayer: Connecting to the Heart of God

During this 21 days of prayer and fasting, Take at least 15-20 min daily to pray and read your devotional. Also join us in our virtual zoom prayer Wednesday and Friday at 5:30am, and in person prayer Monday and Thursday at 5:30am.

Fasting: Making Room for the Spirit

Fasting is an act of surrender. By setting aside food, distractions, or comforts, we are saying: "Lord, You are what I desire most." Fasting makes space for the Spirit to work in us, breaking chains, silencing the flesh, and filling us with fresh power to walk in freedom.

Operation Phillip: Evangelism

Just like Phillip in the Scriptures who said, "Come and see," we are called to invite others into the presence of Jesus. Each day, you will receive a practical challenge to testify, invite, and share your faith. Evangelism is not an optional add-on—it is the heartbeat of God. Every testimony you share, every invitation you extend, and every word of hope you speak has the power to change eternity.

Operation Phillip – Igroup Challenge

We believe revival doesn't happen alone—it happens together! That's why this 21-day challenge is not just personal, but also for every Igroup. As you pray, fast, testify, and invite, your small group can make an eternal impact in people's lives.

The Challenge

Every Igroup will work together during the months of October through december to invite new people to church. Each time someone you invite actually attends, make sure to scan the QR code and record their name under your Igroup.

The Reward:

The top 2 Igroups that bring the most new people to church during this challenge will receive a 2-day retreat in the mountains in January 16th-17th 2026! A time of refreshing, fellowship, and vision for a new year awaits your group

The Mission:

This is more than a contest—it's a calling. Every invitation is a seed planted, every testimony is a chain broken, and every soul that says "yes" is heaven rejoicing. Let's rise as a church and fulfill the Great Commission together.

Week 1 Romans

1 What I need the most is the Spirit

The Christian life cannot be lived in our own strength. Just as breath fills our lungs and gives us life, the Spirit fills us and gives us power. Without Him, our words fall empty and our efforts lack fruit. But when we are full of the Spirit, boldness rises in us. We find ourselves testifying of His goodness, inviting others to "come and see" what He has done. This week, let the cry of your heart be: Holy Spirit, I need You above all else. As you draw near, may He fill you with courage to share Christ with those around you.

Declaration

Holy Spirit, I confess that I need You more than anything else in this life. You are my breath, my strength, and my guide. Without You, I cannot walk in victory or testify with power. Fill me again, and let my life be a living invitation for others to "come and see" what You are doing.

3 Daily Prayer

Spirit of God, I open my heart completely to You. Remove every distraction that keeps me from depending fully on You. Just as You helped the early church in their weakness, help me in mine. Give me boldness to speak, courage to share, and faith to believe that You will work through me. Let my words and actions point people to Jesus, today and every day.



Week 1 Operation Phillip



Focus: Testify of what the Spirit has done for you.

Day 1: Share a short testimony with a friend about how the Spirit has helped you.

Day 2: Pray for 2 people by name and send them a Scripture of encouragement.

Day 3: Invite one person to Sunday service with you.

Day 4: Ask someone today, "How can I pray for you?" and follow through.

Day 5: Post a short "come and see what God is doing" encouragement with #OperationPhillip.

Day 6: Call or text a family member to remind them of God's faithfulness.

Day 7: Write down 3 names of people you will consistently pray for and invite.

Fremember to scan the QR code and add the names of the people you invited and came to church this month.



Day 1 Week 1

The Holy Spirit helps us

Bible Verse

Romans 8:26-27 (NLT)

And the Holy Spirit helps us in our weakness. For example, we don't know what God wants us to pray for. But the Holy Spirit prays for us with groanings that cannot be expressed in words. And the Father who knows all hearts knows what the Spirit is saying, for the Spirit pleads for us believers in harmony with God's own will.

Reflection

I'm sure this has happened to you—those moments when you don't know what to say to God in prayer.

It's happened to me too. Our words often fall short in the face of pain, confusion, or heavy burdens.

But we are not alone!

The Holy Spirit helps us! Yayyy!

That is something to celebrate. I don't know about you, but this fills me with joy and encouragement. The Holy Spirit intercedes for us in a beautiful way that goes beyond what we can express.

He prays according to God's perfect will, even when our hearts cannot find the words. This reminds us that our prayers are never in vain, because the Spirit Himself is on our side—helping us in our weakness and guiding us toward God's purpose.

Application

- What do you do when you don't have the words to pray?
- Remember—it's not the perfection of your words that touches God's heart, but your sincerity and the help of the Holy Spirit.
- Rest in the assurance that God knows your heart even when you don't know how to express it.
- Trust that the Holy Spirit always intercedes for you according to God's will.

Prayer

Lord, thank You for the Holy Spirit who helps me in my weakness. When I have no words, He intercedes for me. Teach me to depend more on Your Spirit and to trust that You know my heart. In Jesus' name, amen.

Day 2 Week 1

God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit..." – Pray for His love to fill you.

Bible Verse

"And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us." – Romans 5:5 (ESV)

Reflection

God's love is not just spoken—it is demonstrated. The Father sent His only Son to die for us, showing the greatest act of love the world has ever known (John 15:13). Through the cross, we see the depth of His sacrifice, but through the Holy Spirit, we experience that love daily. The Spirit continually reminds us of what Christ has done and pours God's love into our hearts in a way that transforms us from the inside out.

This love is not temporary or shallow—it is eternal, steadfast, and powerful. The Holy Spirit enables us to extend forgiveness, show grace, and love others with a love that goes beyond human understanding. It is a love that does not depend on how we feel or how others treat us, but on God's unchanging nature.

When it feels impossible to love someone who has hurt you, or to show kindness to someone you think doesn't deserve it, that is the very moment to lean into the Spirit's power. As we pray, worship, and meditate on God's Word, the Spirit fills us with His presence, reshaping our desires and aligning our hearts with God's. His love in us equips us to live differently—reflecting Christ's sacrificial love in a world that desperately needs to see it.

Application

- Where in my life right now do I feel empty or unable to love?
- How can I invite the Holy Spirit to fill me with God's love in that area?
- Who can I show God's love to today, allowing the Spirit to work through me?

Prayer

Thank you Father, for the gift of your Spirit. Please help me identify where I need to show your love in my life. As I dwell in your presence, may the Holy Spirit pour into my heart, empower me, and confirm my hearts desires to Yours. Thank you, Lord for loving me.

Day 3 Week 1

No longer slave to sin

Bible Verse

11 In the same way, count yourselves dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus.

12 Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body so that you obey its evil desires. 13 Do not offer any part of yourself to sin as an instrument of wickedness, but rather offer yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life; and offer every part of yourself to him as an instrument of righteousness. 14 For sin shall no longer be your master, because you are not under the law, but under grace. Romans 6:11-14

Reflection

I was talking to my 8-year-old son about the consequences of misbehaving. For two days, he wouldn't be allowed to play outside. He looked at me and said, "Mom, I don't want that! I want to be free!"

I seized the moment to teach him that when we sin, we become enslaved and cannot truly live in freedom. But when we make choices that please God, we experience real freedom—life feels lighter, and our hearts are at peace.

As parents, it's easy to understand the importance of discipline in guiding our children. Similarly, our Heavenly Father corrects us and warns us not to remain bound by sin. Thanks to Jesus' sacrifice, we live by grace—but we should not abuse that grace. God wants us to live in freedom, but not in a way that destroys us.

Like my son, don't miss the opportunity to live free: free to play, to laugh, to enjoy life, and to pursue the purpose God has called you to. You are His instrument. Stay tuned to His voice and follow His guidance.

Application

- In what areas of your life do you feel trapped or burdened by sin?
- · How can you align your daily choices with God's will to experience true freedom?
- Are there habits or behaviors you need to let go of to live lighter and freer?
- How can you better "tune in" to God's voice to guide your decisions?

Prayer

Lord, thank You for the freedom You give through Your grace. Help me to live in a way that honors You, letting go of anything that enslaves me. Teach me to recognize Your voice, follow Your guidance

Day 4 Week 1

The Battle of your mind, the victory in the spirit

Bible Verse

I joyfully agree with God's law in the inner person. But I see another law at work in the members of my body, waging war against the law of my mind and making me a prisoner of the law of sin at work within my members. What a miserable person I am! Who will free me from this life dominated by sin and death? Thank God! The answer is in Jesus Christ our Lord. —Romans 7:22–25

Reflection

We all face a constant battle in our minds. We want to do what is right and pleasing to God, but negative thoughts and those opposed to His will often attack us.

In this inner struggle, we need to draw closer to God and take every thought captive to the obedience of Christ (2 Corinthians 10:5).

God never leaves us alone. He gives us the opportunity to overcome sin and conquer thoughts that try to steal our peace. Thanks to the Holy Spirit, we can have a renewed and calmer mind in Him.

Application

- What do you do when negative thoughts enter your mind?
- Do you make an effort to take those thoughts captive to God?
- Remember, the most important thing is to seek the filling of the Holy Spirit each day through Bible reading and intimate time with God.
- Remove distractions that prevent you from living with joy and enjoying the life God has given you.

Prayer

Lord, help me control my mind and thoughts that do not build me up. Fill me more with You and teach me to take every thought captive to Christ. Thank You for the Holy Spirit, who strengthens me and gives me peace. In Jesus' name, amen.

Day 5 Week 1

Embracing Freedom in Christ

Bible Verse

"There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, for the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and death." — Romans 8:1–2

Reflection

As we meditate on Romans 8:1–2, we encounter a powerful declaration: there is no condemnation for those who belong to Christ Jesus. This is not merely a theological statement; it is an invitation into a transformative reality. The Apostle Paul emphasizes that for those in Christ, the heavy shackles of guilt and shame have been broken. This passage assures us that our past does not define our future and that we are fully embraced by God's grace.

In these two verses, we see the contrast between the law of the Spirit of life and the law of sin and death. The former brings freedom, hope, and new life, while the latter symbolizes the binding nature of sin and the resultant death. Understanding this distinction is crucial as we navigate our daily lives, allowing the Holy Spirit to lead us away from habits that bring despair and toward the abundant life Christ promises.

Life Application Through a Biblical Counselor Lens

1. Understanding Your Identity in Christ

Recognizing that you are "in Christ Jesus" is foundational to embracing your new identity. Reflect on your self-perception: Do you carry the weight of past mistakes? Do these define your worth? Write down promises from Scripture that affirm your identity in Christ—redeemed, forgiven, and cherished.

2. Releasing Guilt and Shame

Shame can be paralyzing, often rooted in the belief that we are unworthy of love or forgiveness. Because Romans 8:1 declares that there is "no condemnation," we can actively release these emotions. Spend time in prayer, asking God to help you let go of lingering guilt. Reframe negative thoughts: instead of dwelling on failures, focus on God's forgiveness.

3. Embracing the Role of the Holy Spirit

The law of the Spirit signifies the empowerment we receive through the Holy Spirit. This is an invitation to actively engage with His guidance. Identify areas where you feel trapped in sin or struggle, and invite the Holy Spirit into those spaces, asking for clarity and strength to overcome. Recognize patterns that lead to unhealthy choices and intentionally seek His help to break them.

4. Moving from Fear to Freedom

The promise of freedom is pivotal. Many live in fear of judgment or failure, but in Christ, we experience liberation. List fears that hold you back from living fully in faith, then counter each with Scripture that affirms God's love and acceptance. For instance, if you fear making mistakes, remind yourself that God's grace covers your imperfections and His strength is made perfect in your weakness (2 Corinthians 12:9).

Day 5 Week 1

Embracing Freedom in Christ

Application

- Are there areas in your life where you feel trapped by sin or past mistakes?
- How can you actively take thoughts and fears captive to Christ today?
- What steps can you take to rely more on the Holy Spirit in your daily decisions?
- Which Scriptures remind you of your freedom and identity in Christ?

Prayer

Gracious Father, thank You for the incredible gift of no condemnation in Christ Jesus. Help me to understand my identity in You so that I may walk in freedom, unhindered by guilt or shame. I invite Your Holy Spirit to guide me as I navigate my struggles. Teach me to release my fears and embrace the life You have called me to, rooted in love and acceptance. In Jesus' name, amen.

Day 6 Week 1

Living sacrifices, transformed by the renewing of the Spirit

Bible Verse

Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship. 2 Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind.

Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing, and perfect will. Romans 12:1-2

Reflection

When you think of a sacrifice, chances are the Old Testament comes to mind, where an animal needed to be sacrificed for an atonement of sin. Or the sacrifice of Christ may be the image you see. A sacrifice never gets up from the altar, leaving and ensuring that the one to whom the sacrifice was given must restore what was sacrificed.

A "living sacrifice" can be hard to comprehend. You must offer up your comforts and preferences to Christ as a sacrifice to serve him. Realizing that your talents, gifts, and your life are only given to you to serve and praise the one who gave them to you will make it easier to give them back to Him. You are not called to be like this world, but instead a light in the darkness. Light is the absence of darkness, and when you realize that you are sacrificing the darkness of this life to walk in the light of the life that Christ offers, you will then truly understand what it means to be a living sacrifice

Application

- Look at your life and the things that you are holding on to...What do you need to sacrifice?
- Pray and ask God to allow you to renew your mind and open your eyes to see the life he has for you.
- Ask yourself what talents you are using for your own personal gain, and think of ways they could be used to bring glory to God.

Prayer

God, make me a living sacrifice. You have called me to be set apart and Holy, but I need help. I need you to transform me and renew my mind. Help me to understand your will for my life and give me the courage to lay down the things that bring darkness into my life. Let me use the gifts and talents you have given me for your honor and your glory as I shine a light in this dark world. In the holy name of Jesus Christ, I pray. Amen

Day 7 Week 1

God, the Source of Hope

Bible Verse

"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in Him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." — Romans 15:13 (RVC)

Reflection

There are many things in this life that bring us happiness: a new house, the latest car, a stable job, long-awaited vacations, a good salary, or a steady bank account. While all of these can bring joy, they can never give us true peace. Peace comes only from God.

But what happens when we put our hope in that stable bank account, and suddenly the unexpected happens and everything is lost in an instant?

The joy and hope built on these things collapse because they are temporary and belong to this earthly world. The Apostle Paul invites us to place our hope in God, because only He can fill us with complete joy and peace through faith. When we allow the Holy Spirit full access to guide us in this perfect hope, we stop adopting the customs of this world and allow Him to renew our minds so that we may discern the will of God, which is good, pleasing, and perfect (Romans 12:2).

Application

- Am I putting my hope in temporary and unstable things?
- Do I experience peace no matter what tomorrow may bring?
- Am I allowing the Holy Spirit to guide me in making wise decisions?

Prayer

Blessed God, I come before You today. Examine my heart and do not allow my hope to be diverted toward the temporary things of this world. Instead, I ask that Your Holy Spirit who dwells in me guide every step I take. I ask this in the name of Jesus. Amen.

Week 2 1 Corinthians

Gifts of the Spirit for the Body of Christ

Without Him, our words fall empty and our efforts lack fruit. But when we are full of the Spirit, boldness rises in us. Declaration

Day 8 Week 2

The Spirit reveals the deep things of God.

Bible Verse

However, as it is written: "What no eye has seen, what no ear has heard, and what no human mind has conceived—the things God has prepared for those who love Him—these are the things God has revealed to us by His Spirit. The Spirit searches all things, even the deep things of God. For who knows a person's thoughts except their own spirit within them? In the same way, no one knows the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God. What we have received is not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, so that we may understand what God has freely given us." 1 Corinthians 2:9–12

Reflection

I love how that Bible passage ends: we have not received the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who comes from God. The Word tells us that Satan is the father of lies, but in contrast, our God fulfills what He speaks. When God tells us something and reveals it through the Holy Spirit, we can be certain that He will do it. When we love God, His Word says that our eyes have not seen, our ears have not heard, and our minds have not conceived what He has prepared for us. I remember an occasion when, while talking to God, I said: "I'm going to buy myself a bag with enough space to carry my Bible or a Christian book, so that when I'm at an appointment or waiting, I won't waste time on my phone but instead use that time to learn Your Word." Two days later, someone I love very much came to me with a gift bag and said: "Jenny, the Lord told me you needed this. There are two little things in the bag." When I opened it, you can imagine what I found... the bag! With enough space for my Bible—and in addition, \$100! I was in shock. It was a beautiful detail from my God. He gave me more than what I had wished for. And I know that He also takes care of all who love Him.

Application

- In what areas of my life do I need to trust that God fulfills what He promises?
- How can I replace distractions with opportunities to grow in God's Word?
- When was the last time I recognized God's care for me in the small or unexpected details?

Prayer

Lord, thank You for giving us Your Spirit and for reminding us that You always fulfill what You promise. Help me to trust You in every detail of my life and to recognize Your care, even in the small things. May I never forget that You give abundantly more than I could ask or imagine. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Day 9 Week 2

A Home for God

Bible Verse

1 Corinthians 3:16 (NIV) — "Don't you know that you yourselves are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in your midst?"

Reflection

When we consider God — the Creator of heaven and earth, who formed every part of this world and the whole universe — we recognize that by simply speaking His name we acknowledge His supreme power and authority. He demonstrates His power through miracles, and more importantly, He has always desired to be with His people.

From the beginning the Bible presents a close God. Exodus 25:8 (NIV) says, "Then have them make a sanctuary for me, and I will dwell among them." Because God is holy and sin separates us from Him, He gave very specific instructions for a place where He could dwell: the tabernacle, built exactly as He commanded. Likewise, Genesis 1:27 (NIV) reminds us that "So God created mankind in his own image, in the image of God he created them." When we look at another human being, we see God's image.

The wonderful truth is that God desires to dwell in us. Through Jesus' sacrifice we have the privilege of being sealed by the Holy Spirit — He now lives in our hearts through the salvation we receive when we accept Jesus as Savior. That truth carries great responsibility: our bodies are the temple where God lives, and wherever we go the Spirit of God goes with us. How we live — our behavior, speech, care for ourselves, even our eating — should reflect what dwells within. So the question is: What have you done to prepare that place?

Application

- In what specific ways have I cared for my body and life so that it can be a suitable dwelling place for God (for example: habits, rest, food, personal holiness)?
- What sinful habits or attitudes (excesses, unkind speech, judgment, envy, comparisons, humiliation of others) do I need to confess and remove so the Spirit can dwell freely in me?
- How will I invite God to examine and transform me this week through prayer, Scripture, and asking the Holy Spirit to fill and guide me?

Prayer

Almighty God, I come before you because you alone know me and formed my heart. Search me and help me change anything that keeps me from being a place where you want to live. Forgive me for the wrong I have done; help me to become more like you. Thank you for loving me and for making me your home through Jesus. Live in me — make my body your dwellina. Amen.

Day 10 Week 2

Honor God with your body -You were bought with a price

Bible Verse

"19 Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own; 20 you were bought at a price. Therefore, honor God with your bodies."

1 Corinthians 6:19-20

Reflection

If you were asked to put a price on yourself, what would it be? The God of the Universe values you so much that He sent His Son to pay the price for your life so that you could one day be with Him in Heaven for eternity! When you accept Jesus as your Lord and Savior, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit. This seal identifies you as God's, and Holy Spirit dwells within you. The Holy Spirit is with us 24/7 to guide, comfort, and remind us whose we are. He helps us accomplish the things God has for us to do on this Earth. What a gift! What a treasure!

This verse reminds us that our bodies are temples—a sacred place. We are to honor God with our bodies. How do we honor God with our bodies?

First, avoid anything that would defile your body—sexual sin desecrates your temple. Sexual sin can open spiritual doors to harmful influences and disconnect you from God. Flee any thought or path that leads to sexual sin, physically or in your imagination.

Second, use your body to glorify God—show His love to others, serve Him, and be that shining light in the darkness. When people see you, they should recognize there is something different about you in a good way!

Third, work to keep your body physically and spiritually healthy. When our bodies are physically or spiritually unhealthy, we cannot perform the tasks God has for us to do well. We may make an attempt, but it doesn't give Him glory and may even harm the furthering of His Kingdom. You have been bought with a great price. You are God's precious purchase—you don't own your life anymore; He does. It's a win-win situation when you are God's. His ways are higher, and He only

wants the best for you. He will not abuse you. His Spirit is within you.

· Are there things that you need to "disconnect" from that could potentially defile your temple?

Prayer

Day 11 Week 2

Varieties of gifts, same Spirit – given for the common good..." – Pray for His Gifts to be active in your life.

Bible Verse

"Now there are different gifts, but the same Spirit. There are different ministries, but the same Lord. And there are different activities, but the same God works all of them in each person. A manifestation of the Spirit is given to each person for the common good:" 1 Corinthians 12:4-7 CSB

Reflection

God wants to use your life as an instrument in His hands to bless your family, your colleagues, your workplace, and your brothers and sisters in Christ. But the way that He carries it out is perhaps different from how we would imagine for it to happen. We may possibly think that He uses the most qualified or those that are skilled in public speaking. Maybe our past experiences have led us to believe that Jesus only likes to use a specific type of person or groups of people. Nothing could be further from the truth — Jesus desires to use anyone with a humble heart in whom His Spirit dwells in.

By sending us His Spirit into our lives, Jesus was equipping us for those very same activities and purposes to bless those that surround us and to expand His Kingdom on Earth. The Gifts that the Holy Spirit provides are freely given to all Believers. Contrary to contemporary belief, these aren't necessarily skills that one acquires through regular education. The Bible teaches us that these Gifts are specifically given and activated by the Holy Spirit Himself, making them "Supernatural" rather than natural skills. So how do they "activate"?

The Holy Spirit's Gifts activate by Faith. Was there a time where you felt that something or someone was prompting your heart to speak to someone about Jesus or perhaps give a word of encouragement? Where you ever prompted in your heart to stop what you're doing and begin praying for a situation that needed attention? Did you receive a strong impression in your heart to trust the Lord against all odds? In each of these examples, it was Faith in Jesus that initiated these actions. Faith causes you to step out of your comfort zone and into unchartered territory where the Holy Spirit likes to actively and freely operate in your life.

Application

- Will I live my life today in my comfort zone or invite the Holy Spirit's activity and Gifts into my life?
- What do I consider weaknesses in my life? Can I begin to believe that Jesus wants to use my weaknesses to demonstrate His Supernatural Gifts?
- · How will I invite the Holy Spirit to use me in each area of my life?

Prayer

Thank you Father, for the gifts of your Spirit. Please help me rely on you and your Gifts to love people and be effective for your service. I invite you Holy Spirit into my daily life and my activities. I welcome your gifts into my life and I ask that they operate in me to help those around me. Thank you, Lord for using me.

Day 12 Week 2

One body, many parts - we are all baptized by the Spirit.

Bible Verse

1 Corinthians 12:12 The human body has many parts, but the many parts make up one whole body. So it is with the body of Christ. 13 Some of us are Jews, some are Gentiles, some are slaves, and some are free. But we have all been baptized into one body by one Spirit, and we all share the same Spirit.14 Yes, the body has many different parts, not just one part.

Reflection

ve always believed that if you're alive today, it's because God still has something special in you that He wants to use. He has placed within each of us a unique purpose, something no one else can bring to the body of Christ in quite the same way.

There are things God has woven into your being, gifts, passions, experiences that belong to you alone. And His Word encourages us not to hold those things back, but to share them. To offer them freely for the strengthening of His Church.

But how often does the enemy whisper the opposite? "You don't matter.", "You have nothing to offer.", "No one will miss you if you're not there." Lies.

Have you ever experienced a vitamin deficiency? It might seem like a strange example, but think about it: when even one small vitamin is missing from the body, it can affect everything. Energy drops. Systems malfunction. Healing slows down. The body just doesn't function the way it should. In the same way, 1 Corinthians reminds us that every member of the body of Christ is essential. You are essential. Just like that one small vitamin, you have a role to play in the health and function of the whole body.

It doesn't matter where you come from, north, south, east, or west. It doesn't matter what language you speak or what your past looks like. If you are in Christ, you are part of something bigger than yourself. We are all united by one Spirit, the Holy Spirit, who empowers us to work together for one purpose: to share the gospel of Jesus and to testify to His goodness and glory.

So today, if you've been doubting your value or questioning your place in God's plan, remember this:

You are needed. You are called. You are part of the body.

Don't hide what God has placed in you. Someone else's healing, encouragement, or breakthrough might just be waiting on your obedience.

Application

- What is the unique gift, passion, or experience God has placed within me that sets me apart as a vital part of the body of Christ?
- In what specific ways can I begin to actively use that gift to glorify God and strengthen others, rather than keeping it hidden or underestimated?
- What bold, faith-filled step is God prompting me to take today to ensure that I'm contributing to a healthy, unified, and fully functioning body of Christ through His Spirit?

Prayer

Father, thank You for giving me life and purpose. Thank You for the unique gifts You've placed in me to strengthen Your Church. Help me reject the lies of the enemy and remember that I am needed, called, and part of the body of Christ. Give me courage to walk in obedience, to share what You've entrusted to me, and to glorify You in all I do. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Day 13 Week 2

The Spirit Works Through Love

Bible Verse

1 Corinthians 13:1-3

13 If I speak in the tongues[a] of men or of angels, but do not have love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. 2 If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. 3 If I give all I possess to the poor and give over my body to hardship that I may boast,[b] but do not have love, I gain nothing.

Reflection

The Word teaches us that the Holy Spirit distributes the gifts and then clarifies their purpose in 1 Corinthians 13. Gifts are tools, but love is the essence that gives them life. The most extraordinary gifts have no value without love. We may prophesy, sing, teach, or serve with excellence, but if we do it without love, we are only a "resounding gong" or a "clanging cymbal"—just noise without purpose.

Here we see two spiritual truths: 1. Without love, gifts are empty. Gifts exercised without love do not transform lives; they only impress for a moment. Love is what gives meaning to prophecy, teaching, service, and every spiritual work. Without it, gifts become an outward performance with no true fruit. 2. The Spirit works through love. The Holy Spirit moves powerfully in us when our gifts are exercised from a heart of love. It is not only about what we do, but how and why we do it. Love is the channel that allows the Spirit's power to flow purely, building up the church and revealing Christ. Gifts then become instruments of grace.

When we serve, we must remember that behind it there is a life that needs encouragement, a family that needs hope, a heart that needs healing. Using gifts without love can wound, but using them with love builds up and restores.

Application

Before ministering, pray: "Lord, fill me with love for my church." Look for ways to connect with people, a sincere conversation, a hug, a private prayer. Allow your gift to be a reflection of your love for people and for Jesus. Remember that the purpose of every gift is to build up the body of Christ (1 Cor. 12:7).

I invite you to examine your heart and ask yourself these questions:

- · Am I using my gifts with the right motivation?
- Do I do it to be seen, or so that Jesus may be glorified?
- Am I using my gifts with love?
- In what areas do I need to grow in the fruit of the Spirit so that my gifts reflect Christ?
- In what ways can I practice love before serving with my gifts?

Prayer

Father, thank You because in Your love You have given me gifts to serve. Forgive me if I have ever used them seeking recognition or with an empty heart. Protect me from using the gifts for my own glory. Today I ask You to fill me with Your compassion, fill me with Your love, the love that is patient, kind, humble, and faithful.

Holy Spirit, remind me always that my gifts are for lifting up the weary, for healing the broken, and for strengthening Your people. Help me love people as You love them, and see in every brother and sister an opportunity to show Christ. May my service never be noise without purpose, but rather a channel of Your love and grace. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Day 14 Week 2

Pursue Love, Earnestly Desire the Spiritual Gifts

Bible Verse

1 Corinthians 14:1 (NIV) — "Follow the way of love and eagerly desire gifts of the Spirit."

Reflection

The verse we just read establishes the proper order of things:

- 1. Follow the way of love
- 2. Eagerly desire gifts
- 3. Not just any gifts, but the gifts of the Spirit

A lack of order in this verse, or the exclusion of any of these three points, would lead to disorder and a lack of fullness in our lives. When one begins with love, automatically whatever we desire afterward will be for the benefit of others, not ourselves. This brings true satisfaction in using our gifts to serve others.

Secondly, we must earnestly desire the gifts, meaning we ask the Lord for them. If we desire gifts without love, we are really seeking recognition and personal gain.

Finally, it is not just any gift, but the gifts of the Spirit. This means they are not about our own abilities or what we can accomplish on our own. It is the Spirit of God using us as His vessels and instruments. When these gifts are exercised, people do not see us — they see Christ reflected in us and give Him the glory.

The beauty of this is that it inspires others to draw closer to God and depend on Him. Be careful that your heart does not desire gifts to make people cling to you or depend on you — as humans, we are limited and can never meet all their needs. Guard against ego; the Word clearly states that the gifts are for the benefit of His Church.

Walking in love while earnestly desiring the spiritual gifts is an invitation to take up our cross and follow Christ.

Application

- How can I ensure that love is the foundation for my spiritual gifts?
- In what ways can I intentionally pray and ask God to fill me with the gifts of the Spirit?
- How can I use my gifts to serve others and point them to Christ rather than seeking recognition for myself?

Prayer

Lord Jesus, help me to follow the way of love in everything I do. Teach me to earnestly desire the gifts of the Spirit for Your glory and the good of Your Church. Guard my heart against selfish ambition or pride, and help me to use my gifts to serve others and point them to You. Fill me with Your Spirit and guide me each day to walk in love and humility. Amen.

Week 3 2 Corinthians

1 Spiritual Warfare and Freedom

Every step we take in evangelism is a step onto the battlefield of the soul. The enemy works to keep hearts bound in darkness, but the Spirit works to bring freedom. Every testimony you share, every invitation you extend, every moment you speak Jesus' name is an act of warfare that breaks chains. Evangelism is not just outreach—it is advancing the Kingdom of God. This week, rise up in the Spirit's power. Walk in the freedom Christ has given you, and proclaim it so others may be free as well.

Declaration

In the name of Jesus, I declare that where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. I am no longer a slave to fear, shame, or sin. Every testimony I share, every prayer I lift, and every invitation I extend is a weapon that tears down strongholds. I walk in victory because Christ has made me free.

3 Daily Prayer

Holy Spirit, strengthen me for the battles I face. When I feel weak, remind me that Your power is made perfect in weakness. Help me to put on the full armor of God and to stand firm in the truth of Your Word. Use me to proclaim freedom over others who are bound, and let every chain fall at the sound of Your name. May my life be a testimony of Your power, and may others experience freedom through the gospel I share.

Day 15 Week 3

Where the Spirit of the Lord Is, There Is Freedom

Bible Verse

2 Corinthians 3:17 Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom.

Reflection

We used to live in chains, and didn't even realize it. We didn't think about how our routines affected the way we thought, acted, and lived. At each step, we carried unnecessary weight, spiritual burdens, and chains that kept us from running to the altar.

But then one day, the Holy Spirit came. He lifted those heavy chains off our shoulders and whispered for us to walk. Those few baby steps toward the feet of Christ were everything He needed to throw open His arms of love and embrace us with His grace. He cried for joy because His lost child came back home. On that day, we cried with freedom, breathed deeper, hugged tighter, and for one moment, we knew what it felt like to be free.

Now, back to my reality today, I wonder: Am I still walking with that same freedom that was given to me on that day, or have I gone back to pick up the chains off the floor on my way out from the holy place that set me free?

Sometimes, it's hard to live in freedom. Our old chains have a familiar scent and a sense of comfort. They feel warm, and we are unbothered to carry them around; they have become a part of us. Today is a good day to lift up our head and dump those chains. Jesus paid with His blood the price of our freedom so that we could live without them. We don't need them. That chained-up person stayed in the past. We are no longer that person.

Remember what Jesus said:

John 8:36 So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed.

John 10:10 The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.

Application

- What chains are holding me down today that I need to let go of urgently?
- What chains are holding me down that are also affecting my spouse, family, or friends?
- What steps will I take to ensure the Holy Spirit takes priority in my routine?

Prayer

Father, be pleased in our praise and rejoicing together. We know your word says 'for where 2 or 3 are gathered in my name, there I am among them'. Be amongst us, as we fellowship for your glory. May Inspire Church be strengthened and empowered by your Holy Spirit as we come together to fellowship, to break bread, to pray, to witness your move, and find things in common with each other, together. We exalt you in this church, be magnified and glorified. In Jesus name, Amen!

Day 16 Week 3

My plan and God's plan

Bible Verse

"Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moths and vermin destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moths and vermin do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." Matthew 6:19-21

Reflection

"Where do you see yourself in five years?" - the question heard throughout the world. Used in job interviews, vision-casting meetings, personal planning, group development huddles/circles...people say "Man plans and God laughs". Well, King Solomon said it better in Proverbs 16:

"To humans belong the plans of the heart, but from the Lord comes the proper answer of the tongue. All a person's ways seem pure to them, but motives are weighed by the Lord. Commit to the Lord whatever you do, and he will establish your plans."

Don't get me wrong, I am all for careful, thoughtful and detailed planning, starting from the way I wake up, ending with the way I go to sleep. I sometimes plan the technique I'm using to tie my shoes in an effort to maximize my available time! But we cannot get so hung up on our own planning that we exclude God's purpose with our lives. Instead, we should pray and ask ourselves: "God, how do my plans align with your purpose? Do they?" And surely he will answer.

Jesus himself said in Luke 14:28:

"Suppose one of you wants to build a tower. Won't you first sit down and estimate the cost to see if you have enough money to complete it?"

And that is exactly what our thought process needs to be. Jesus is explaining that His disciples need to be all-in, to the point of abandoning everything. There's nothing wrong with dreaming and planning your life out, and even achieving your hard-worked goals is something you should celebrate! But our desire to be a faithful servant, to be intimate with God, and to align your plans with his calling, is something we should strive for. Now more than ever, we need to follow Jesus, to answer His calling to serve and reconcile.

The world needs to see God move in our families and we have been chosen to let his light shine amidst our generation. Discover God's purpose for you through prayer and by reading His word.

Application

Evaluate your current plans: Would you say they are aligned with God's purpose for your life? What has been your focus in this current season of your life - are you focused on God? According to Matthew 6:21: Where is your treasure?

Prayer

Father God, we come before you today thanking you for your faithfulness. You have been good to us and I believe the best is yet to come for our Inspire Church and our communities. Allow us to see what you see in us, so that our plans and desires can be aligned with yours. Speak to us and help us overcome any adversity that might deviate our focus from you. Let our life be a living testimony so others may see the great God you are. We are here, willing and ready. We love, honor and praise you - in Jesus' name. Amen.

Day 17 Week 3

Weapons of righteousness — Standing firm in the Spirit.

Bible Verse

"By the Word of Truth, by the power of God; through weapons of righteousness for the right hand and the left hand."

2 Corinthians 6:7 CSB

Reflection

Have you ever met someone who was ambidextrous with their hands? Someone who could use their left hand just as well as their right hand? It's certainly quite rare and an impressive skill to master if patience and determination are your friends. Yet, this is the very way that the Holy Spirit wants to use us; with such an ability that those who surround us are amazed at His power working through us.

You see, the world and our society eagerly wait for justice and peace — but from the wrong sources. They place their faith in their human efforts to create a righteous, utopian type of world. However, this can only truly come when humanity places their faith in Jesus, which brings the true righteousness of God (2 Cor 5:21). So what part do we, as believers, play in God's plan for righteousness?

We hold the Word of Truth (sword of the Spirit) in one hand as well as the Shield of Faith in the other. With one hand, we help a struggling brother/sister in Christ to not lose hope and to place their trust in Jesus while with the other, we offer godly wisdom to people far from God who are in desperate need for answers or solutions. With one hand, God can use us to teach in such a way that the even toddlers could understand the profoundness of the love of Jesus while with the other, we inspire a sense of identity and purpose to those who feel lost. The point of the matter is that we don't limit the Holy Spirit's influence in our own lives or His desire to use us in ways beyond our capabilities of imagination. He's still equipping us for a time as this.

Application

- Do I consider myself a one-dimensional Christian or could He use me in other ways?
- What has been dormant in my life that can be used for righteousness, i.e., to do good?
- What has God given into my hands that can be used for righteousness?

Prayer

Thank you Father, for the weapons of righteousness that come by your Spirit. I invite your influence, your tactics, and your compassion to lead me in the works of righteousness that you've prepared for me to walk in today. Keep my hands strong for your service and to love my neighbor as myself. Thank you, Lord for using me.

Day 18 Week 3

Our warfare is spiritual; strongholds fall through the Spirit.

Bible Verse

2 Corinthians 10:3-5

"For though we live in the world, we do not wage war as the world does. 4 The weapons we fight with are not the weapons of the world. On the contrary, they have divine power to demolish strongholds. 5 We demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and we take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ."

Reflection

This portion hits me differently because I had to break this down for two different people this past week. As Christians, we get so caught up in the worries and stress of life that we sometimes forget that we live in a physical world, but we belong to a spiritual kingdom. A fundamental kingdom principle is precisely this: the fact that we do not wage war against flesh and blood but against strongholds and principalities. And the fact is, the Bible is telling us in this portion that the weapons we were granted have the power to demolish these strongholds. What's amazing is that the Greek text used to define "divine power" is also used by Jesus in Matthew 19:26 — "Jesus looked at them and said, 'With man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible.'" The text used here talks about what God can do, what is made possible through Him, and what is empowered by Him. It's only through Him that we can overcome!

What Paul was saying is that if we take refuge in God, the Holy Spirit has the power to demolish spiritual strongholds and will empower us to wage war against the principalities that wish to overtake us. Take courage today and know that you are not alone, and that God has granted us His Spirit so that we can overcome in His name. Seek Him first above all things, at all times, and everything else will fall into place. Be careful that what you're allowing into your life isn't swaying your thoughts. Take captive everything that you know goes against God and bring it into obedience in Christ. Our weapons overcome when we seek God first and wholeheartedly.

Application

- Is putting God first, always, a priority in your life?
- Do you often try to fight your battles on your own, without letting God empower you through prayer and reading His Word?
- Identify what you are allowing into your life that is swaying your relationship with God. Bring it into
 obedience in Christ.

Prayer

Lord Jesus, thank you for everything we possess. Thank you because everything we have does not really belong to us and it is only because of you that we can live, eat, work, rest and do everything in our life. Holy Spirit encourage us to give more if we already practice giving. And if we still do not practice giving, let us worry about giving and dare to live in abundance. Your word says that you take care of the birds of the field, how much more will you take care of us. You are our supplier. Teach us to give and to become more like you every day. In the name of Jesus we ask you everything, Amen!

Day 19 Week 3

My grace is sufficient

Bible Verse

2 Corinthians 12:9-10

9 But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. 10 That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong.

Reflection

In a society that is full of people who are prideful of how "great" they are, this Bible verse is teaching us not to be prideful in how "great" we are. Rather, we should be boastful and prideful of how weak we are, because we know that in our weakness Christ is made strong. When was the last time you heard someone genuinely boast about how terrible or weak they were, and actually meant what they were saying? It hardly ever happens anymore. We should rejoice and be glad in our weaknesses. John the Baptist celebrated the fact that he was losing disciples. Because these disciples were no longer coming to him to be baptized, but were going to Jesus to be baptized. And rather than having a competitive mentality, or being prideful and confronting Jesus for "stealing his disciples," he said some of the most profound words in all of Scripture: "I must decrease, so that Jesus will increase."

Application

- Where in your life do you need to be weaker?
- Maybe you've tried being in control too much, and it's not allowing Christ to move freely in your life.
- Being weak isn't shameful, but puffing up your chest when the Lord walks by is.

Prayer

Lord, I pray that daily I may become weaker. May Your glory shine through my weakness, and let that light be a testimony of how great and powerful You are. Humble me when I'm exalted, and exalt me when I am humbled. I pray that I decrease so that You can increase. And I rejoice for the grace that has come over me — that was sufficient yesterday, is sufficient for today, and will be forever. Thank You, Jesus, for being great in my weakness.

Day 20 Week 3

The Communion of the Spirit Unites and Strengthens Us

Bible Verse

2 Corinthians 13:14 (NIV) — "May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all." Amen.

Reflection

This is how Paul ends his letter to the Corinthians, reminding us that the most important aspects of the Christian life are the grace of Christ, the love of the Father, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit. It's easy to think we can do everything on our own, but the truth is, we cannot! We are not completely independent — we are interdependent. We need God! Apart from Him, we can do nothing. But we are also a body with our brothers and sisters in faith. The Holy Spirit connects us, helping us love, forgive, and serve one another, even when there are differences.

Jesus Himself prayed for the unity of His disciples: "That they may be one, just as we are one." (John 17:22 NIV) It is vital to depend on the Spirit, listen to His guidance, and allow Him to teach us to live in harmony. When we study the Word, love, and serve together, we let God use us for greater things than we could do alone.

The communion of the Spirit strengthens us and keeps us united. We are not alone — God gives us His Spirit to walk together and fulfill His purpose on earth.

Application

- How do you feel the Holy Spirit guides your day-to-day life?
- In what ways can you live more connected with Him and your spiritual family? (Start now)
- What area of your life do you need to surrender to the Spirit to receive His direction and power? (Surrender it)

Prayer

Holy Spirit, thank You for Your presence in my life. Thank You for being my Comforter, Helper, Intercessor, the One who convicts me of sin and helps me live in fellowship. I want to depend on Your guidance each day and be an instrument of unity and love for others. Amen.

Day 21 Week 3

Prepare a room

Bible Verse

Psalm 41:1-2

"As the deer pants for streams of water, so my soul pants for you, my God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When can I go and meet with God?"

Reflection

Picture this:

A deer has been running for its life, pursued by a predator. Every muscle burns, every breath is heavy, its mouth is dry. It is desperate, panting, searching for water. It's not a casual search; it's searching because survival depends on it.

That's the picture of spiritual warfare.

You and I face predators too: the pressures of life, the attacks of the enemy, and the weight of temptation chase us down; we've all felt it. Our strength alone is not enough.

Just as the deer must find water to keep going, we must be filled by the Holy Spirit to stand strong.

When we cry, "Holy Spirit, I need You", we are not just admitting weakness, we are seeking victory. The Spirit is the living water that refreshes us, strengthens us, and makes us unshakable even when the enemy is near. Surrender is our strength.

Jesus says in John 7:37-38 "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me and drink… rivers of living waters will flow from within them."

He is the living water!

Application

- In what areas of your life do you feel like the deer pursued, weary, and desperate? How
 can you turn that desperation into a cry for the Holy Spirit?
- What "false streams" (things you run to for relief) do you need to let go of so you can be filled by the living water of Jesus?
- How can you make space this week to pause, surrender, and be refreshed by the Holy Spirit so you are strengthened for the battles you face?

Prayer

Holy Spirit, I need you more than anything else. I cannot fight on my own. I surrender my strength, my strategies, and my struggles to You. Be my strength where I am weak, my peace where I am anxious, my victory where I feel defeated. Refresh me with Your living water until I overflow with Your power and Your love. My victory is in You. Amen.
